Separate multi-material

packaging (example: remove metal, plastic, or other lids from glass containers) and reduce its volume if possible.

Dispose of materials

in the correct color-coded container and put them out according to the days and times shown in the calendar.



Do not litter on the streets or outside the containers.

Any violation will result in penalties in accordance with current regulations.

Food waste and compostable bioplastics

FOOD WASTE AND COMPOSTABLE BIOPLASTICS

(use only compostable bioplastic carrier bags)

What to dispose of: food scraps and vegetable or animal kitchen waste, coffee grounds and tea bags, white paper napkins only if soiled with food, cut flowers, small plants, leaves. **Compostable bioplastics** (packaging such as shopping bags and fruit and vegetable bags, tableware, films, trays, containers, netting) bearing one of the following marks on the individual item or on the packaging:



What NOT to dispose of: plastic, glass, paper and cardboard, aluminium, metals, composite materials (multi-layer), diapers and incontinence pads, sanitary pads, chewing gum, mussel, clam and similar shells, cigar and cigarette butts, pet litter, pruning waste (diameter greater than 5 cm), non-compostable baking paper, laminated or aluminium-coated paper, vacuum dust or other household cleaning waste, used vegetable oil, textiles.

PAPER AND CARDBOARD

(Use only paper bags)

What to dispose of: food containers (e.g., pizza, chips, fried foods, etc.) without food residue, paper bags (e.g., bread, fruit and vegetables, flour, sugar, etc.), newspapers, magazines, comics, commercial printing, sheets of paper of any size, cardboard sleeves, paper or cardboard packaging such as preserves, shoe boxes, all cardboard packaging for household and personal hygiene products, medicine boxes, paper cups, clean paper napkins and towels, cardboard tubes, receipts (plain paper and thermal paper if they state on the back that they are recyclable because they are phenol-free).

What NOT to dispose of: receipts (if made of other thermal paper), waxed paper, plastic-coated paper, baking paper, used paper towels, cardboard packaging with food residue, soil, or chemical stains. In general, anything that isn't paper.

CARDBOARD PACKAGING

(display packages flat and stacked on the floor)

Corrugated cardboard and cardboard packaging that is not soaked in substances, and does not contain adhesives, metal, or plastic.



PLASTIC AND METAL PACKAGING

(Residue-free. Use semi-transparent bags to check contents.)

What to dispose of: plastic bottles, food and yogurt containers, disposable cups, wrapping film and polystyrene, household and personal hygiene product bottles, food bags and pouches, fruit and vegetable nets, beverage and food cartons (e.g., juice, milk, sauce), meat and fish trays, empty plastic and aluminium tubes for toothpaste, creams, and ointments, blister packs, clothes hangers (plastic hangers and steel ones from laundries), beverage cans, spray cans (empty), boxes, tins, metal jars and cans (steel and aluminium), caps and lids, aluminium tubs, plates, and trays.

What NOT to dispose of: bulky plastic items (basins and buckets), toys, household appliances and their parts, glue, nail polish, and paint containers, plastic cutlery, rubber objects, CDs, DVDs, video cassettes including their external containers, plastic and/or rubber pipes, electrical cables and components, film, photographic plates, and bioplastic bags, lighters, technical gas cylinders and canisters (e.g., camping gas, water carbonators, helium for balloons, refrigerant gases, etc.).

GLASS PACKAGING

(throw them away without the bag)

What to dispose of: bottles, food containers, jars, small bottles, and flasks. Items must be empty and without caps of any kind (metal, plastic, or cork).

What NOT to dispose of: plastic bags, crystal objects (chandeliers, centerpieces), glass glasses, mirrors, ceramic and porcelain objects, glass-ceramic containers, light bulbs, window glass, car windows, headlight glass, neon tubes, glass medicine containers.

NON-RECYCLABLE RESIDUAL WASTE

What to dispose of: diapers and incontinence pads, sanitary napkins, mussel, clam and similar shells, nylon stockings, non-recyclable rags, cigarette butts, vacuum cleaner dust and bags, audio cassettes, DVDs, razors, brushes, laminated and baking paper, plasters, chewing gum, thermal paper such as that found on some receipts.

What NOT to dispose of: all separable and recyclable materials (glass, paper, cardboard and paperboard, plastic, steel and aluminium, food leftovers, kitchen waste and compostable bioplastics), small and large WEEE, bulky waste, pharmaceuticals, batteries and accumulators, used vegetable oil, wood.



Bulky waste and WEEE

(End-of-Life Electrical and Electronic Equipment)

Mattresses, furniture, large and small appliances, computers, TVs... **you can take them to the Municipal Collection Centers (CCR).**

Remember that you can drop off various types of waste at the **CCRs** free of charge: **toner, expired medicines, batteries, lamps...**
